Gather Them in

I will gather yet others to My house for all peoples. Isaiah 56:8, 7, adapted.

It happens all the time in my house, gathering up dishes, clothes, toys and kids. I am certain that it happens a great deal in your house as well. It is just a central part of life that there is a “time to gather” (Ecclesiastes 3:5). It is no different for God’s house either, except that it is time for us to gather in the people who bear Christ’s name, who have been called according to His purpose, and who have been given the gift of salvation by grace. It is time for us to gather in those who do not know our Savior Jesus Christ and help them to know His love, His care, and His saving power. Now is the time for us to “Gather Them In.”

At Zion we are blessed to have a school, blessed to have a beautiful sanctuary, blessed to have wonderful music and blessed to have faithful servants of the Word in our called workers. Our loving God continues to daily and richly provide for the needs of our souls through Bible studies, worship services and opportunities to partake of the means of Grace. We are truly a blessed congregation. Sometimes we fail to see all these blessings or we are simply content to have them for ourselves. Yet we have two-thirds of our baptized members who do not partake of these blessings. Our calling is to gather them back into God’s house for all people and help them to share in all that the Lord is doing among us. Our calling is to gather them into the Lord’s house because he loves them and because God loves them too. There are many reasons why they are not here in worship with us but we are going to love them enough to listen, to care, and to welcome them back to their home among us and with us. It is time to “Gather Them In.”

Yet our concern is not simply to gather in those who have stopped coming to worship. Our calling is to go out into the

world and make disciples. God has a mission and it is to save all people through Jesus Christ and to accomplish that mission, God created the church. As a church we are to be concerned about those who do not know Jesus and seek to help them to know Him as the only savior who forgives, who strengthens for this life, and who gives eternal life. It is also time for us to gather these people into the church as well and to love those whom God loves.

Will it be easy for us to go into a time of gathering? No. It is not easy work to make disciples and to gather up the family of God. Yet it is our calling and our only mission. We summarize this mission in just a few words, “Everyone, Everywhere, Sharing Christ.” Now we must focus on these words as a time to gather them into the house of the Lord. I hope and pray that you will see fit to pitch in and lend a hand in gathering them in by praying, visiting, fellowshiping and helping in this one mission of the church.

THE LIFESTYLE OF FAITHFUL STEWARDS PROPORTIONATE GIVING

“A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the Lord; it is holy to the Lord.” (Leviticus 27:30).

“On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income....” (1 Corinthians 16:2).

Proportionate or percentage giving gives all Christians an equal privilege and opportunity to share in extending God’s kingdom. Since God blesses us in different ways and amounts, the sizes of our gifts will vary, but God directs us all to give in proportion to our blessings. *“For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have”. (II Corinthians 8:12).* The person giving \$100 from \$1,000 of income is just as faithful as someone giving \$1,000 with earnings of \$100,000. We can give proportionately whether we are rich or poor.

We are able to give proportionately by faith. The proportionate percentage we give will be determined more by our spiritual maturity than by our financial ability. To give generously is a leap of faith, and it shows our trust and dependence on the Lord.

SCRIP

Do you know about Zion’s Scrip Program? Basically, Scrip is like buying gift cards that may be used to purchase whatever you want at the individual retailers/restaurants and those vendors donate a percentage of the face value of the certificate to Zion. There is a wide variety of vendors and they donate anywhere from 1.5% to 25% back to Zion.

Zion offers certificates from over 100 businesses and restaurants—all names you know: Amazon.com, Bath & Body Shop, Best Buy, Build-A-Bear, The Galley, Heller Nursery, Kroger/Scott’s, Lowes, Land’s End, Gap/Old Navy, Toys-R-Us, Applebee’s, Burger King, Indiana Pancake House, Pizza Hut, Pizza King, Red Lobster/Olive Garden, Richard’s, Spring Garden, Walmart, Wendy’s, etc. (Complete lists are available at glscrip.com and scrippro.com). A new addition to our Scrip family is BEST ONE TIRE (formerly Townsend Tire), giving 5%!

Other than a little preplanning, SCRIP is totally painless and a “no actual cost out of pocket” way to donate to Zion. You pay face value for the certificates and you, or whomever you give them to, redeem them for face value. The vendor gives Zion a percentage of the face value. If significant numbers participate regularly, Zion stands to substantially benefit financially.

How It Works: Plan for anticipated needs for presents, groceries, dinner out, movies, clothes, fast food, gas.

Fill out Scrip forms which are available in the School and Church offices. Please fill out completely and decide how you wish to pick it up. You will also need to designate where the percentage will go (such as a school family, Zion Church, etc.) Include correct cash or check made out to ZION LUTHERAN SCHOOL. Orders must be turned in to the School office by 3 p.m. on Monday to be received the same week.

Kroger cards are reloadable. Once you purchase a Kroger card, you may reload it at the Service desk in the store with any amount you choose.

If even 50 families bought approximately \$100 worth of certificates for things they would be buying and spending on anyway, Zion could potentially average \$500 in donations.

STEPHEN MINISTRY AT ZION

Earlier this summer, Pastor Gadbow and Starley Baxter were given the opportunity to spend a week in Florida as trainees for the new Stephen Ministry series. Now at first glance, this may seem like fun in the sun, but let me assure you, it was not. After 50 hours of training, they received certification as Stephen Leaders for this recognized service organization of the LC-MS. Throughout the week they were reminded that all Christians have received God's gifts that are beneficial for the Church. Some are blessed to be teachers, some to be pastors, others evangelists and caregivers, etc.

In Stephen Ministry, members of Zion are trained to be caregivers. Starting in September, Pastor Gadbow and Starley will be offering training through the Stephen Series. The commitment is only one hour a week, and it will bring a wealth of knowledge and confidence to equip you in caring for those you love. Learning how to simply listen to and pray for those who are hurting can make a tremendous difference in someone's life. To become an official Stephen Minister requires 50 hours of training, but you can spend time being a shoulder to lean on, long before that. As a caregiver, you'll nurture and use your God-given abilities for the sake of the Church, and all the while you'll be growing in your Christian faith.

The purpose of the Church is to reach out with the love of Christ to those who are hurting. Through Stephen Ministry, you will see God at work in your life, giving you a renewed purpose of making a difference in the lives of others. Think of the many different people God places in our lives, and imagine how you can be a part of the ministry of the Church bringing healing to those about whom you care the most. As a caregiver, you will simply be the Christian friend that God has already made you to be: someone who listens, cares, prays, supports, and encourages others. Stephen Ministry will make a difference in our community to help Zion become an even warmer, more loving church family.

Jesus tells us in John 13:34, "A new command I give you; Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." What better way to love one another than to become a Stephen Minister. Helping someone in need is what Christian love is all about. Prayerfully consider joining our sessions in September, even on a trial basis. TREASURER'S REPORT

The operating account balance as of 7/31 is \$2000. Year to date actual cash shortfall is \$80,000 as compared to \$57,900 last year. Year to date revenue is down \$6,000 as compared to last year while expenditures are up by \$16,000. The decrease in revenue is not based upon the total offering amounts which are comparable (\$267,000 in 2011 and \$265,000 in 2010).

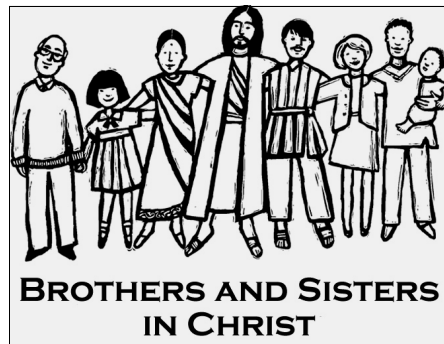

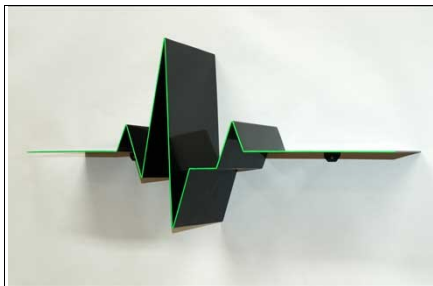
